Emerging Artists Grant Program

Questions & Answers, 2008-2009

Deadline: Monday, September 15, 2008, 9 p.m.

This is not a postmark date. All applications must be delivered to:
Durham Arts Council, 120 Morris Street in downtown Durham by this date.

What is an emerging artist?

An emerging artist is an artist that has mastered the basic techniques in her/his art form and who is attempting to launch a professional career in the arts or an artist taking his/her established career in a new direction. An artist is not required to have any particular degree or type of education to qualify as an emerging artist.

What is the Emerging Artists Program?

The Emerging Artists Program (EAP) is a project grant program that provides financial support to developing or established professionals by funding a project pivotal to the advancement of their careers as artists. Pivotal projects may happen at different stages of a career, therefore Emerging Artists Grants are not restricted to "unestablished" artists. 2008-2009 Emerging Artists Grants are intended to fund a particular project that will occur between January 1 - September 30, 2009. The Emerging Artists Program begins its 25th year in 2008-2009.

Who is eligible to apply for a grant?

Artists practicing any art form are eligible to apply for a grant. Applicants must have resided in Chatham, Durham, Granville, Orange, or Person Counties for at least one year immediately prior to the application deadline (since September 15, 2007). Applicants must be at least 18 years of age and cannot be currently enrolled in a degree or certificate program in their art form at the time of the **application deadline**. Applications for grants are available at the DAC Web site, www.durhamarts.org or from the Arts Council/Commission for each county. Recipients of 2007-2008 Emerging Artists Grants may not apply for a 2008-2009 grant.

What is the deadline for submitting applications?

Applications are due at the Durham Arts Council Building by 9 p.m., Monday, September 15, 2008. All portions of the application must be submitted by this date, although letters of support, should you choose to submit them, may arrive by Monday, September 22, 2008. **Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.**

Who decides which artists receive awards?

Grant applications and support materials are reviewed by local professional artists in each art form, their comments are then forwarded to the EAP Committee who reviews applications, recommendations and then makes the final award decisions for all EAP grant applications.

Who funds the Program?

The Emerging Artists Program is funded through grants from the North Carolina Arts Council, an agency funded by the State of North Carolina and the National Endowment for the Arts, which believes that a great nation deserves great art, The Mary Duke Biddle Foundation, the Orange County Arts Commission, the Chatham County Arts Council, the Granville Arts Council, the Person County Arts Council, gifts to the Durham Arts Council Annual Arts Fund, the Ella Fountain Pratt Fund, The Wainwright Fund for New Works and private & corporate donations.

What type of projects are likely to be funded?

The Emerging Artists Grant Committee is interested in assisting the development of an artist's career as is appropriate to the particular artist's needs, so be sure to define clearly the relationship of your project to your career development. In the past, grant awards have provided funds for the following types of expenses:

- 1) **Promotion/Presentation:** *the cost of producing a demonstration CD for a composer, a video tape or DVD for a choreographer, a portfolio for a graphic artist, editorial assistance for a writer, etc.*
- 2) **Travel:** *to specific workshops, auditions, retreats or seminars; or to do research intrinsic to his/her art form.*
- 3) **Services:** *rental of equipment or facilities for presentation or creation of a new work.*
- 4) **Supplies:** *purchase of supplies, materials or equipment necessary for the completion or production of a new work which is considered by the artist to be essential to her/his career.*
- 5) **Training:** *advanced workshops, master classes or coaching that will enhance the artist's abilities. This program does not support work towards a degree.*

Can I get assistance in filling out the grant application?

Yes, Durham Arts Council and partner counties will offer information sessions to explain the program and answer any questions you may have about completing the grant application. These sessions are free, although we would appreciate your calling the appropriate contact number so we know how many people to expect. You need not attend the session in your own county - attend the session that is most convenient for you, regardless of which county you live in. We expect each to last 60-90 minutes.

What selection criteria will be used?

1. Overall excellence of the applicant's art work and demonstration of exceptional talent,
2. The applicant's serious professional commitment to her/his art form,
3. Contribution of the proposed project to the artist's professional development,
4. Feasibility of the proposed project,
5. Timeline—project should happen between January 1- September 30 of 2009, though extensions will be considered.

How much money can I expect to be granted?

While no specific minimum has been established, the maximum amount an applicant can request is \$1,500. We generally try to support full funding of the requested amount.

Will I be required to provide a final report of my use of the grant?

Yes, we require both a financial and narrative report. A report form will be sent to those receiving awards. Future awards will be contingent upon the submission of a final report.

PROJECT BUDGET: Six copies of the budget for your project. Itemize projected expenses and proposed sources of income, including this grant. See below for examples of project budgets.

RESUME: Six copies of a resume which includes arts education, employment, exhibitions, performances, publications, commissions, and honors.

REFERENCES (OPTIONAL): Your application may be supported by up to three letters of recommendation. Please list the anticipated references in your application. Letters should be addressed to the Emerging Artists Committee, Durham Arts Council, 120 Morris Street, Durham, NC 27701 and be received no later than Monday, September 22, 2008. Letters of recommendation are not required and we only need one copy of each, if you choose to submit them.

DOCUMENTATION: You **must** submit materials documenting art that you have completed *in the last three years*.

For painting/drawing, photography, craft, sculpture and installation*: up to 10 images in slide, CD (jpeg format, 980 pixels by 1080 pixels) or, photographic format, dvd, or standard size VHS tape) 3-5 minutes in length

For film/video:** 1 copy of DVD or standard size VHS tape 3-5 minutes in length

For dance:** 1 copy of DVD or standard size VHS tape 3-5 minutes in length

For drama:** 1 copy of DVD or standard size VHS tape 3-5 minutes in length

For music:** 1 copy of CD 3-5 minutes in length

For literature: Six (6) copies of a CD containing up to 12 pages of manuscript - OR- Six (6) hardcopies of up to 12 pages of manuscript.

YOU SHOULD LABEL ALL DOCUMENTATION WITH YOUR NAME, TITLE OF WORK, DATE OF WORK. *VISUAL ARTS: INCLUDE IMAGE SCRIPT, SLIDES/PHOTOGRAPHS SHOULD BE LABELED AND INCLUDE DIMENSIONS, MEDIA OF WORK AND INDICATE TOP OF IMAGE.

**PERFORMING ARTS/FILM/VIDEO: MATERIALS MUST INCLUDE A SHORT EXPLANATION OF YOUR ROLE IN CREATING THE SAMPLE PIECE. In addition you may also submit reviews, programs, catalogues.

SELF ADDRESSED STAMPED ENVELOPE: if you wish us to return your documentation materials include a self addressed envelope of the appropriate size and with adequate postage to mail your materials. **If you do not include such an envelope you may pick up your materials during a specified time following the notification process. After that time the materials will be discarded.**
