Call for Course Proposals

The ArtsCenter in Carrboro, NC has moved our ArtSchool program online during the COVID-19 pandemic. This new online initiative offers teaching artists and instructors the ability to continue teaching from the safety and convenience of their own homes. Because we do not have physical distance limitations for online programming, we are extending this opportunity to teaching artists throughout our region.

About the ArtSchool

New classes in theater, creative writing, painting, drawing, fabric arts, mixed media and more are being offered via Zoom on a rolling basis throughout the spring and summer. New classes are announced every two weeks. The ArtsCenter provides access to Zoom pro accounts for instructor use.

Our curriculum is driven by instructors' interests and expertise. Instructors work with ArtSchool administrators to refine their creative interests and course proposals so that we can effectively reach students of varying abilities.

Classes are announced to over 20,000 emails on The ArtsCenter's semi-monthly newsletter mailing list and promoted to our students via email blasts, social media (12,000+ followers), and ads.

Tuition fees are standardized by class length. Instructors are encouraged to set their own minimum and maximum enrollments for online classes. Revenue from classes is split between instructors and The ArtsCenter.

Instructors proposing online classes should consider students' limited access to art supplies and materials during the pandemic, and make clear what materials students will need for their class.
