Suggested Supplies List

- 1. Canvas already stretched, cotton or linen, recommended sizes: 11" x 14", 12" x 16", or 16" x 20"
- 2. Gamsol which is an odorless, colorless solvent. Absolutely no turpentine or mineral spirits.
- 3. Glass or metal containers (1 or 2) to hold Gamsol
- 4. Paper Towels or Cloth Rags
- 5. Palette
- 6. Brushes (1 or 2 of each size / type): Numbers 2, 4, 6, 8, and 10 / Flat, Round, and Filbert
- 7. Palette knife (2) prefer small, diamond shape knives
- 8. Oil painting medium (not required): Gamblin solvent-free Gel
- 9. Oil paint I use Rembrandt, Gamblin, Windsor Newton, and Holbein*
 - Titanium White
 - Cadmium Yellow Light
 - Cadmium Orange
 - Cadmium Red Light
 - Alizarin Crimson
 - Yellow Ochre Light
 - Burnt Sienna
 - Van Dyke Brown
 - Viridian (green)
 - Ultramarine Blue
 - Cobalt Blue
 - Ivory or Mars black

I also use 2 additional colors for landscape painting: Sap Green and Sevres Blue (sky)

^{*}Holbein makes excellent greys for landscape painting: Neutral Grey, Monochrome tint cool, Monochrome tint warm, Violet Grey, & Rose Grey
